May be used for Machinery/equipment; Job training; Infrastructure; Land and building improvements; Environmental assessment/remediation; Acquisition of land, buildings, right-of-ways; Working capital; Site preparation.	Department of Community and Economic Development			The maximum assistance amount shall not exceed \$5,000 for each job projected to be created or retained. The Department has discretion to modify this amount for special circumstances. The interest rate for loans shall be set quarterly based on the 10-year Treasury rate. Loan terms will not exceed 15 years for real estate and infrastructure or 10 years for machinery and equipment. There is a 1% commitment fee on all approved loans.

Workforce & Economic Development Grant	http://www.wednetpa.com/Qualify/	To obtain job training funding through WEDnetPA, your company must meet the following qualifications: Employers must be based in Pennsylvania or have a significant presence in the state. Participation is limited to two years in a row and three out of the past five years. Training must commence by February 1st or by the end of the fiscal year, whichever comes first. If not, the funds will be forfeited. Point-of-sale retail businesses, gaming establishments, training vendors, employment agencies, government agencies, government-owned facilities, education and nonprofit entities are ineligible. Employers must be manufacturing or technology businesses including Biotech and Environmental-Tech companies. Employees must be frontline employees or first-level supervisors. On-the-job and orientation training do not qualify for the program. Funds cannot be used to address workplace adult literacy needs. Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development			\$1,000-per-job tax credit to approved businesses that agree to create jobs within three years. Twenty-five percent of the tax credits allocated each year must go to businesses with less than 100 employees. Tax credit awards shall be equal to 5% of the taxpayers increase in annual taxable payroll, if increased by at least \$1,000,000 above a pre-determined base year amount.
