At no cost to the employer, apprenticeship consultants are available to guide companies through the registered apprenticeship development process from initial information to full recognition in the national Registered Apprenticeship System. A statewide board appointed by the governor and comprised of business owners, state government officials, educators and private citizens guides policy for all WIA-funded programs. WIA programs help businesses meet their need for skilled workers and provide individuals with access to training that helps them prepare for work. Training is provided by WIA through certified training providers throughout the state to help jobseekers get the education and skills required for in-demand jobs.
